

J. T. BRUSH WILL BE BURIED FRIDAY

Body of Late Financier, Merchant
and Baseball Magnate
Reaches Indianapolis.

INTERMENT IN CROWN HILL

Masons Will Conduct Rites, Ac-
cording to Their Ritual, at
Church or Grave.

The funeral of John T. Brush, president of the New York National League baseball team and principal owner of the When clothing store in Indianapolis, who died in his private car early yesterday morning between Louisiana, Mo., and St. Louis, will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon from the St. Paul's Episcopal Church, New York and North Illinois streets. The burial will take place at Crown Hill Cemetery.

The body of Mr. Brush reached the city at 6 o'clock last evening from St. Louis and was taken to the home of Harry N. Hempstead, 1222 North Alabama street, a son-in-law and treasurer of the When Clothing Company, of which Mr. Brush was president.

DR. BROWN TO PREACH.

The funeral address will be delivered by the Rev. Lewis Brown, rector of St. Paul's Church. The Episcopalian service will be used, together with a full choir, and there also will be ceremonies by the Masonic orders.

The Masonic orders will be represented by delegations from the Harper Commandery, Knights Templar, and the Adrialiam Lodge of Perfection, Scottish Rite.

The body will be escorted from the home to the church by these delegations, the former under the command of Lieutenant Commander W. J. Scoonover and the latter led by Thrice Potent Master Logan C. Scholl.

Mr. Brush was a thirty-third degree Mason, also a member of the Mystic Shrine.

The honorary pallbearers will be chosen from his old fraternal associates. The active pallbearers will be selected from among the younger employes of the When Store. Contrary to usual custom there will be no Masonic rites at the grave.

MRS. BRUSH DUE TODAY.

A telegram was received from Mrs. Brush and the daughter, Miss Natalie Lombard Brush, who have been at Bryn Mawr, Pa., where the daughter is attending school, that they are en route to Indianapolis and will arrive before noon today.

Scores of telegrams from friends and business associates of Mr. Brush have been received at the home of the son-in-law, where the body was taken last night.

The body was accompanied from St. Louis by Mr. Brainard, representing the New York Central lines. It will be kept at the Hempstead home, where friends may view it until the funeral takes place.
