

101-year-old area pioneer dies in city

One of Alberta's oldest citizens, Milton Jefferson Gowin, age 101, died Tuesday.

Mr. Gowin came to Alberta from Minnesota in 1902 and farmed in the Horse Hills district. He moved to Washington State in 1925 and resided there until 1940, when he returned to Alberta. He lived at RR 6, Edmonton, until his death.

He is survived by three sons, Alton of Edmonton, Vernon of Prescott, Ariz., and Russell of Crescent City, Calif.; a daughter, Mrs. B. C. Marsh of Vancouver, Wash., and a brother, Grant, of Lethbridge.

Survivors also include nine grandchildren and 21 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held Friday at Foster and McGarvey Funeral Chapel, with burial in Edmonton Cemetery.
