TOLL OF BLIZZARD MOUNTS

Three More Bodies Found in West—Man Dies of Exposure.

DENVER .- (A)-The severity of last week's blizzard in the west was emphasized again Wednesday by the discovery of the bodies of three more storm victims and by the death in a hospital of a man found in a dying condition in a snowbank. The additional deaths increased the number of winter's victims to twenty-four. Authorities constructed a story of death from starvation and exposure after finding the bodies of Mrs. Pearl Fenton and her two year old son in an isolated mountain cabin forty miles south of Buffalo, Wyo. The frozen body of Teodora Sanchez was found near a sheep camp in southern Colorado.

In North Dakota where the storm has lingered, E. B. Lumbard died in a Fargo hospital from exposure suffered when he was marooned in his car Tuesday night. Fair weather continued to prevail in the Rocky Mountain region and most of the west, however.
