You are hereby notified that Lizzie L. Martin, the plaintiff, has filed a complaint against you in the District Court of the Third Judicial District, holding terms at Seattle, Washington Territory, which will come on to be heard sixty days after the first publication of this summons, to-wit: Sixty days after the 1st day of October, 1888, and unless you appear and answer the same on or before the 31st day of December, 1888, the same will be taken as confessed, and the prayer of said complaint granted.
