Hilton H. Wheelock

With perfect resignation of the divine will and peace that follow a Christian life of faith and love, Mr. Hilton H. Wheelock heard the call of the Master and surrendered his soul into his hands Wednesday night, October 7, 1925, after an illness of only a few days. As was characteristic of his strength of will he bore his illness bravely and patiently.

The grief that has befallen his family is shared with the community at large and by all, whose privilege it was to know him.

He was the son of Silas and Phoebe Wheelock, who spent most of their life in Hamburg, as did their son. His wife, Orpha Wheelock died in 1915. Three children survive him, Frank and Alton Wheelock and Mrs. H. A. Titus. He married Mrs. Mimken in 1922, who also survives him. Mr. Wheelock was a very active member of the Presbyterian church, where he was an elder. He belonged to Fraternal Lodge, F. and A. M. and I. O. O. F. and he was a thirty-second degree Mason.

His funeral was held from his late residence on October 10, with the Rev. F. O. Leonard officiating, assisted by the Rev. Fowler. The active bearers were Mr. Harry Riggins, Mr. C. H. Hawkins, Mr. D. B. Pierce, Mr. Charles Kronenberg, Mr. Nicholas Mimkin and Mr. Ray D. Marvin. Honorary bearers were Mr. C. J.
