DIES DURING AUTO TRIP

Mrs. O. Lombard, Wausau, Expires In Stockton Today

Mrs. Orlando Lombard of Wausau died at the home of her sister, Mrs. Frank Gibbs, in the town of Stockton at 4:50 o'clock this morning. She was taken ill Saturday night after stopping during the course of an automobile trip from Wausau to the Chain o' Lakes near Waupaea. The cause of death was cerebral hemorrhage. A couple of years ago Mrs. Lombard had suffered a similar attack and a slight paralysis of one arm and leg had remained. Otherwise her health had been good. She was making the automobile trip with her husband and had stopped to spend the night with her sister and family. She was taken ill about 11 o'clock the same night.

Mrs. Lombard was formerly Miss Carrie Madge Carver, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Carver, and was born in the town of Stockton June 18, 1880. She was married to Mr. Lombard in Stockton April 25, 1910.

Mrs. Lombard is survived by her mother, who now lives with a son in Wausau; three sisters. Mrs. L. R. Quitt of Wausau, Mrs. Frank Gibbs of Stockton and Mrs. Earl Bozley of Stockton; and six brothers, Elmer of Wardner, Ida, Judd, George and Vern of Wausau and Myron and Charles of Portland, Ore. A rister, Mrs. Irwin Lutz of this city, died here last January.

Mrs. Lombard was a member of the Royal Neighbors and the Methodist Ladies' Aid society at Wansau.

A short service was held at the Gibbs home in Stockton this afternoon at 4 o'clock, the Rev. F. L. Hayward of this city officiating. The remains were shipped to Wansau where the functal will be held from the home, 410 Second avenue, Wednesday at 2 p. m. Burial will be in Pine Grove cemetery.
