

EX-REVENUE AGENT DIES

Louis Holden Lombard, 40, a former employe of the Internal Revenue department here, died at 2 p. m. Sunday in his home at 324 North Summit street. Because of his illness, he retired from the government service eight months ago.

He was born June 8, 1899 in Chatfield, Minn., the son of A. L. and Aurilla Holden Lombard. He spent his youth in Balfour, N. D., where his father was a banker, and was graduated from St. Thomas college in St. Paul, Minn. He attended the University of Minnesota law school and worked for the International Harvester Co. in Minot, N. D. before coming to Decatur in 1926.

On May 22, 1926 in Chicago, he married Thelma Moe, who survives with a three-year-old daughter, Andrea Jane. Also surviving are his parents, who live in Spokane, Wash. He leaves three sisters, Mrs. Edwin L. Johnson and Mrs. Norman Buslee, of Spokane, and Mrs. A. F. Barber, Glenn Falls, N. Y., and two brothers, Morris, of Colfax, Wash., and A. Loren Lombard of Los Angeles.

Active in American Legion affairs, Mr. Lombard also was a member of the 40 and 8 and played in the Legion "Clown band". He was a member of the Holden chapter of the Masonic lodge in Balfour, Minn.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p. m. Wednesday in the Moran and Sons funeral home, with Rev. Owen W. Pratt of the Westminster Presbyterian church in charge. Burial will be in Fairlawn cemetery with American Legion graveside rites.
