

# DEATH YESTERDAY OF MR. R. O. LOMBARD

He Was One of the Most  
Prominent and Most Sub-  
stantial Citizens of Rich-  
mond County — Funeral  
Monday.

The death is announced, Saturday  
afternoon, at 6 o'clock, of Mr. Ros-  
well Oliver Lombard, in the 63rd  
year of his age.

The funeral will take place Mon-  
day, July 2nd, 5 p. m., at R. E. El-  
liot and Sons' Funeral Home. The  
interment will be in the city ceme-  
tery.

Mr. R. O. Lombard was one of the substantial citizens of Richmond county. His home is nine miles out from the city, on the Deans Bridge road. His farm land holdings comprise thousands of acres of the finest stretch in the county. His home place is beautifully located and the improvements are most attractive. Mr. Lombard owned much desirable city property. The Modjeska Theater, built directly after the 1916 fire, was put up by him and belonged to him. He owned other valuable city real estate.

Mr. Lombard led the life of a well-to-do farmer and business man, respected by his neighbors and enjoying the high regard of all who knew him. He did not care for public life, though at one time he was prevailed upon to accept a county commissionership. He served for a long time on that board, giving valuable service to the county, his extended experience and his high business ability well equipping him for membership on the commission.
