Lawmen Will Hear Rocky Aide Lumbard

Eliot H. Lumbard, special assistant counsel to the governor for law enforcement, will speak in the Triple Cities Wednesday night.

He will address Broome County law enforcement men at a dinner in St. John's Recreation Center in Johnson City.

His topic is "The Law Enforcement Answer to Apalachin."

Plans for the dinner were announced last night by District Attorney Stephen Smyk.

The occasion is the third annual law enforcement dinner in the county. It is sponsored by the district attorney's office in conjunction with the County Magistrates Association.

Mr. Lumbard served for almost three years as chief counsel of the State Investigation Commission. His service

included the period when the commission was looking into the purpose of the 1957 gangland meeting at the home of the late Joseph Barbara, Sr. in Apalachin.

Like other agencies that probed the Apalachin gathering, the commission was unable to break the silence of those who attended.

Mr. Lumbard joined the governor's staff in January, 1961. Most recently, he has headed a committee studying a system aimed at a central bank of information about criminal activity in all parts of the state.
