Charles A. Lombard, a tenant in hotel Revere, corner of Revere and Anderson sts, shot himself in the head with a revolver in his home at about 10 a m yesterday.

He was taken to the Massachusetts general hospital, where he died soon after his arrival. He left a wife and a little child. He was a vegetable pedler.

The act was caused by despondency. He is said to have repeatedly wished that he was dead.
