

DEATH OF MRS J. G. DUNNING

Former State Regent of the Massachusetts Daughters of the American Revolution Passes Away After a Short Illness

Mrs Sarah L. Dunning, 61, wife of James G. Dunning, died Saturday afternoon at her home, 211 Belmont avenue, from heart failure after a short illness.

Mrs Dunning was born in Bath, Me., and was a graduate of the Farmington (Me.) normal school. She taught a few years in the public schools of Bath. In 1884 she married Mr Dunning and came to this city, where she had lived continuously since.

She was very active in patriotic and educational work. She was at one time regent of the local Mercy Warren chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution and held in succession several state offices in this society, having been state auditor, vice-regent and state regent, and at the time of her death was national chairman of the patriotic education committee.

Mrs Dunning was also president of the army and navy comforts club of this city, which has fitted out over 1000 soldiers in this vicinity with knitted goods and comfort kits.

She is survived by her husband and by two sons, Harold G. Dunning of this city and Ensign Ray P. Dunning, United States navy, of Washington, D. C., and also leaves three brothers, Edwin A. Potter, president of the American trust and savings bank of Chicago, Ill.; William P. Potter of Arrowsic, Me., and Capt John G. Potter of Brooklyn, N. Y.
