

FROZEN TO DEATH. — The body of Enoch L. Flood was found in a timber shed at Noble's Island on Saturday afternoon last. He had been missing since Friday January 10th. Flood was a shoemaker by trade, and was once in good circumstances, residing in a house which he owned near the powder house on Istington road; but having acquired a taste for intoxicating drinks, had fallen rapidly during the past few years. He was apparently between forty and fifty years of age.

In his pockets were found two bottles,—empty but retaining a strong odor of rum. three short tobacco pipes, a memorandum book, a pocket book containing a few cents, and one or two other articles.
