DEATH OF JACOB C. LOMBARD

Well-known Real Estate Man Passes

Away in Sixty-second Year.

Jacob C. Lombard, who has been prominent in the real estate business in Rochester for the last quarter-century, died on Sunday morning at his home, No. 176 South Goodman street, aged 62 years. With offices in the Granite building and earlier in the old Chamber of Commerce building he carried on a business of considerable importance.

Mr. Lombard was born in Elbridge, N. Y., and he received his early education there. While a young man, he went to Iowa with his brother, who now is dead. He remained there for about five years, coming to Rochester about thirtyseven years ago. At first he was engaged in the furniture business, with a store in Front street. He began his real-estate business about twenty-five years ago. At the time of his death he was owner of the Centropolis ments, as well as some adjoining property and his home in South Goodman street. When the old Driving Park was shandoned and turned into building lots, Mr. Lombard took an active part in the sale of the property.

He was a member of the Brick Church, Yonnondio Lodge, F. & A. M., and the Country Club. He was an ardent golfer. He leaves only his wife, Mrs. Harriet Campbell Lombard.

The funeral will be held from the home this afternoon at 3 o'clock. But'd will be in Riverside Cemetery, with Masonic services.
