Born in Auburn, N. Y., he was the son of the late Thomas and Carrie (Gillette) Schellenger. He lived in West Springfield and this city for the past 45 years.

From 1920 to 1953 he taught related machine work and mathematics at old Continuation School, Trade High School and Technical High School. He was associated with several industrial firms before entering teaching, among them Fisk Tire Co.

Mr. Schellenger was graduated from Batavia, N. Y., High School and attended Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

He entered the Army in 1908, served as a captain during World War I and was promoted to lieutenant colonel in the Army Reserve in 1934.

Was Reader

He was a member and former first reader of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, the Mother Church in Boston, and treasurer, clerk and a director of the Springfield church.

Mr. Schellenger was a past master of Mt. Orthodox Lodge of Mason; a 32d degree Mason; a member of Scottish Rite bodies and Melha Temple Shrine, a past deputy of the 18th Masonic District, secretary of the Fifth Lodge of Instruction and former chairman of the Masonic Relief Committee.

He leaves his wife, Lila (Lombard) Schellenger; two sons, Harold W. Schellenger, Jr., of West Hartford, Conn., and David L. Schellenger of this city, and three grandchildren. A son, Robert G. Schellenger, died in 1962.
