

—Intelligence of the sudden death of William Brown of Waverly, Ill., occurred at Jacksonville, Ill., has been received. Deceased was the husband of Mary Hopson, daughter of Rev. Oliver Hopson, at one time a prominent Episcopal clergyman of this town, now of Tivoli, N. Y. Mr. Brown was cashier of a bank at Waverly, and was a prominent and influential citizen. Death was presumably caused by the taking of a capsule filled with morphine, deceased thinking it was quinine. A widow and two sons are left to mourn the loss, who have the sympathy of a large number of friends.
