## Radio Call Saves One; Three Drown

A fishing trip for four Tiffin residents ended in tragedy Saturday afternoon when their 16-foot outboard swamped and capsized in stormy Lake Erie just east of Kelleys Island.

Missing and presumed drowned are Sylvester Wagner, 46; his wife, Lois, 42; and Richard Whetherall, 20, all of Tiffin.

Frances Wagner, 17, daughter of the missing couple and fiance of Whetherall, was found by the Coast Guard clinging to a life jacket near the partially - sunken boat, about a quarter mile off
