
SABRINA LUMBARD HURLBURT.

Mrs. Sabrina Lumbard Hurlburt, widow of the late Dr. Horatio N. Hurlburt, died at 5

o'clock yesterday afternoon at her residence, No. 2332 Prairie avenue, from blood poisoning. One year ago last February a partial stroke of paralysis impaired the left side of her body. Some time afterward her left hip was injured by a severe fall. Though not seemingly serious at first, yet this later injury terminated the 80th year of her life.

Mrs. Hurlburt was born at Wells, Vt., Sept. 1, 1812. Her father, Benjamin Lumbard, moved to West Mendon, Monroe County, N. Y. While there she met, and on Feb. 12, 1828, married Dr. H. N. Hurlburt. In 1851 they moved to Chicago. Here were born to them two children, Dr. V. L. Hurlburt and Mrs. Tobey.

Mrs. Hurlburt's life was exemplary, and all meeting her quickly learned to admire her many virtues. Bishop Cheney, of the Reformed Episcopal Church, was her beloved pastor. In church work, as in all other deeds of benevolence and charity, was she foremost and sincere. Her quiet, simple manner of bestowing kindness has always won her praise.

The funeral will be at her late residence to-morrow at 1:30 o'clock.
