Funeral of Mrs. Sabrina Hurlbut.

Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon over the remains of Mrs. Sabrina Hurlbut at the residence of her son, Dr. Vincent L. Hurlbut, No. 2332 Prairie avenue. The services were private, but the house was crowded with friends and relatives. Among the floral gifts was a wreath of white rosebuds, sent by members of the Home Lodge, of which she was a member; a pillow of white roses, with the word "mother" in violets; and a sheaf of wheat, with heliotrope. Bishop Cheney conducted the services. After the prayer and the singing of "Lead, Kindly Light" by the choir, the Bishop read an appropriate passage of scripture, and then said a few words appreciative of the life and character of Mrs. Hurlbut. The burial was at Rosehill and the remains were attended to the grave by Amos Grannis, Dr. Walter A. Stevens, Daniel Westervelt, D. G. Hamilton, Eli Smith, and B. F. Pain as pall-bearers. Mrs. Hurlbut was the widow of the late Dr. Horatio N. Hurlbut, who died recently. She was 80 years of age, and was a native of Wells, Vt.
