TWO WILLS ADMITTED TO PROBATE.

Disposition of the Estates of I. N. Harmon and Dr. Hurlbut.

Judge Kohlsaat yesterday admitted to probate the will of the late Isaac N. Harmon of Hyde Park, which disposes of an estate valued at \$128,000. Harmon, and the residue of the estate to the widow, who resides at No. 3975 Ellis avenue.

The will of the late Horatio N. Hurlbut was admitted to probate yesterday and letters testamentary granted to his son, Dr. Vincent L. Hurlbut. He left an estate valued at \$41,000. The widow, Mrs. Sabrina Hurlbut, is bequeathed the use of the homestead and is given \$300 per annum or more for her support. Then the property goes to Dr. Hurlbut and testator's grandchildren.
