

BROTHERS ARE PRISON WARDS

Three Dickinson County Young Men Doing Time for Different Offenses

Arnold's Park, Ia. — (Special) — Judge Heald of Spencer has sentenced Oscar Lombard, 25 years old, to serve five years in the penitentiary at Fort Madison. He had entered a plea of guilty to the charge of receiving stolen goods. He was taken to Fort Madison by Deputy Sheriff M. C. Nelson and Marshall Will Glade of Milford.

Lombard was arrested a year ago for various thefts, but when he was discovered with the stolen goods in his parents' home he denied that he had stolen the property himself but signed a confession stating that he was keeping the goods for another person whose name he did not know. He was placed in jail at Spirit Lake but escaped soon. He has since been in Sioux City, New Hampton, Minneapolis and other places and has been in this vicinity recently. Forgetting his signed confession of more than a year ago, when confronted with it he admitted his guilt and stated that he had forgotten signing a confession.

Lombard has served one reformatory sentence at Anamosa for stealing the brass fittings from a launch on West Okoboji, being released in 1929. It is on account of this former sentence that he was sent to Fort Madison for grand larceny on the recent charge.

His two brothers are now both serving time in Iowa reformatories. Leonard, who was paroled, was sent back to serve five years for breaking his parole. Andrew Lombard is serving a 10-year sentence for forgery.
