

Guy W. Lumbard Dies in Colorado; Rites in Fremont

Guy L. Lumbard, 73, native of Fremont and former Fremont photographer, died Thursday at Denver, Colo. His home was in Thermopolis, Wyo. He had been ill about three months.

He was a brother of Mrs. Edna Mae Toothaker of Fremont and eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. P. E. Lumbard. His grandfather was the late Rev. Alfred Hitchcock, pastor of the First Baptist church here from 1873 to 1875.

Mr. Lumbard was born Apr. 28, 1876. Always interested in photography, he took a job with a Grand Island studio and while living there met and married Anna Doll. He later had photography studios at Syracuse, Fremont, Sheridan and Lusk, Wyo. He owned the Dwight Gallery on Main street here.

For 15 years he had been associated with a theater in Thermopolis, Wyo.

Mr. Lumbard was a member of the First Baptist church.

Survivors include four sons, Stanley, Carl, Lawrence and Gerald, all of Grand Island; two brothers, Ralph of California and Earle of Flushing, N.Y.; a sister, Mrs. Toothaker; and six grandchildren.

Services are to be at 2:30 Sunday afternoon in the chapel of the Fred Bader Funeral home. Burial will be in Ridge cemetery.
