A man named Lyman Nelson, was drowned in Wells pond, on the 11th inst. He, with two other men, says the *Herald*, crossed the pond in a boat, and went to Granville, N. Y. where they obtained two quarts of alcohol, and returned to the boat very much intoxicated, and when about half way across the pond the boat capsized. The two men made out to swim to the shore, but Nelson was drowned. His body was not recovered until the 13th, and about twenty rods from where the boat upset.
