
Race Trouble in Mississippi.

Memphis, Tenn., May 8.—Reports from Hillhouse, Calhoun Co., Miss., are to the effect that serious race trouble is imminent. A white planter named Lombard interfered and prevented a mob of negroes from lynching one of their own color. Since then his gin-house and other buildings have been burned and at present both sides are armed and the blacks are swearing vengeance. The place is remote from railroads and telegraphs and the blacks number about fifteen to one white. Considerable apprehension is felt for the outcome of the trouble.
